This is going to be a 3 hours WEBINAR including the Insurance Companies, Clinicians, Hospital Management and Consumers.

On 20<sup>th</sup> September we had the Management Committee Meetings at Erode. Family Security Scheme, PPLSSS, Nursing Home Board and Finance Standing Committee Meetings held. Proper protocols maintained we had very fruitful discussions it was one to one meeting after a long time.

In the morning I have inaugurated the hospital for Covid-19 giving preference to health care workers run and managed by Indian Medical Association of Erode Branch. Very good initiative by the Erode IMA I appreciate the President, Secretary and members of Erode Branch for this wonderful initiative. Which is the need of the hour.

### **Action fund**

As per the Finance Standing Committee we have decided to collect for action fund from the Covid Hospitals and also from others.

So that we can give Rs 2 Lakhs to the families of doctors who have died due to covid. We asked the Branch Presidents and Secretaries to send the list of demised doctors due to Covid-19 for the same.

On 29<sup>th</sup> September I once again had Video Conference Meeting with our Honorable Chief Minister of Tamilnadu.

I have appealed him to take care of the rural population since there is relaxation in the lockdown and public transports start functioning. Further asked him to see the availability of Remdesivir for the Covid patients especially in the open market. Already Government of Tamilnadu is taking steps to enroll the Doctors died due to Covid in Private Sectors for Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan project. This is happening due to our constant appeals and pressure.

We have suspended the PPLSSS Manager at JVL PLAZA after getting the reports on her inefficiency. Our members are requested to approach the new manager Mrs. Hemalatha.

On the scam issue forensic auditors have given all the relevant documents once again to the police and to the enforcement directorate. The state office is constantly following this issue without any lag. Our Immediate Past State President Dr. S. Kanagasabapathy and Immediate Past State Secretary Dr. B. Sridhar appeared at Enforcement Directorate and given elaborate statement and I thank them for the same. The enforcement directorate has given clear cut instructions to freeze all the properties of the accused.



The next 305<sup>th</sup> State Council Meet will be at Kodaikanal. The communication has been sent from the State Office. This would be on 1<sup>st</sup> of November. Necessary arrangements being done by our State Finance Secretary Dr. N.R.T.R. Thiagarajan.

The IMA State Office along with IMA CGP going to start a new course on Hospital Infection Control. IMA CGP Faculty Secretary Dr. R. Anburajan is making necessary groundwork for the same.

Our AMS wing got the Best State Chapter Award in the Country. I congratulate and appreciate Dr. V. Amuthan, AMS Chairman and Dr. R. Kannan, AMS Secretary for their Excellent work. Our IT Wing Chairman Dr. M. Vijayakumar has been awarded for his exemplary work. I also thank Dr. M.S. Ashraf, AMS National Chairman for recognising the good work of IMA Tamilnadu AMS chapter.

**Dear Friends,**

It gives me great pleasure to write to you again as your President elect. I have been trying to discuss ways and means for the improvement of

financial management in our association. Because I am keen to see to that, that the sort of financial misappropriation that took place earlier doesn't take place again.

I congratulate our State President Dr. Raja for the stern action taken, by suspending the manager of the guest house for financial mismanagement. I strongly recommend that recovery of the losses is effected from the erring manager. I request the office bearers of PPLSSS to take effective action in this regard. I also request

them to go through the auditor's report and take follow-up actions, based on his observations. They should also rectify the discrepancies in the active membership numbers and present an accurate report on the actual number of members as on 01/04/2020.

FSS scheme has paid 94 claims so far, whereas we have collected funds for only 70 claims. The NRD as a consequence has suffered. The corpus fund including NRD which was 16 crores during 2017 has declined year after year to 10crores as of now. To prevent this, I suggest that the number of claims to be collected may be raised to 100 and the 26th collection be started from November. I request the office bearers of FSS to consider these suggestions.

Once again I request our office bearers of IMA TNSB and wings and schemes to send their reports early for effective scrutiny.

Taking into consideration the

fact that the Covid situation is yet to improve completely, we have planned to have the installation ceremony in Chennai, in the presence of our Honourable Health minister, Health Secretary and other dignitaries, with restricted audience of key office bearers. All our members can view the august function through the online platform and make it a memorable one with all your virtual presence and good wishes. We also plan to conduct a mid year conference and academic meet once the situation improves. I hope our members will understand the situation and wish me well for a successful tenure in the office.

## WORLD PNEUMONIA DAY

**W**orld Pneumonia Day: Respiratory groups call for an end to preventable pneumonia deaths.

In support of World Pneumonia Day, 12 November, the Forum of International Respiratory Societies (FIRS) calls for an end to preventable pneumonia deaths, ensuring equitable access to interventions for prevention and control of pneumonia.

Every minute, two children die from pneumonia, representing 16 percent of childhood deaths globally. Eighty percent of deaths are in children under two years old. Almost all deaths are in low and middle-income countries. Pneumonia is also a common cause of death or illness in the elderly, being the single most common cause of death from infectious disease.

### **Pneumonia is largely preventable**

Good nutrition including exclusive breastfeeding for the first four to six months of life and adequate complementary foods protect against getting pneumonia.

Comprehensive immunisation including vaccines against the common germs that cause pneumonia such as pneumococcus, measles, Haemophilus Influenzae b, pertussis (whooping cough), diphtheria and influenza should be available to all children to prevent pneumonia. Avoiding tobacco smoke exposure and reducing

exposure to indoor air pollution reduces the risk of pneumonia in children. Prevention of mother-to-child transmission of HIV, early use of antiretroviral therapy in HIV-infected children, and cotrimoxazole prophylaxis for HIV-infected and exposed children, can reduce the burden of childhood pneumonia.

### **Pneumonia is largely treatable**

To treat pneumonia, timely access to appropriate management including antibiotics, referral to hospital and oxygen when needed, are critical for children who become ill from pneumonia.

Many children continue to die from pneumonia, largely due to lack of comprehensive, holistic implementation of the package of interventions for pneumonia prevention and treatment.

- Only 40 percent of children less than six months are exclusively breastfed.
- Around 170 million children in low and middle-income countries are not vaccinated against pneumonia.
- Globally, only 35 percent of eligible children get the required three doses of pneumococcal vaccine.
- Only two-thirds of children with pneumonia access treatment.

**To end the preventable burden of childhood pneumonia and deaths there is a need to:**

- Raise awareness about pneumonia, the leading killer of young children.
- Strengthen, accelerate and sustain interventions to prevent and treat pneumonia.
- Focus on equitable access to, and delivery of comprehensive pneumonia prevention and control programs.
- Design specific strategies to reach the “harder-to reach” populations to improve their accessibility to available interventions.
- Conduct research to develop innovative strategies to reduce the burden of pneumonia.

Together, we can end preventable deaths from pneumonia.

**FIRS calls upon governments, health care**

**providers, researchers, funders and families to ensure:**

- Improved, equitable and sustained access to effective pneumonia prevention and control interventions for all by all.
- Strengthened health systems that promptly and effectively deliver strategies to reduce pneumonia deaths including provision of effective antibiotics and oxygen delivery systems.
- Increased support for strategies to prevent pneumonia including immunisation, prevention of mother-to-child HIV transmission, provision of anti-retroviral therapy for HIV-infected children, reduction of exposure to tobacco and air pollution, and increasing access to safe drinking water and sanitation.
- Support for research towards innovative diagnostic, prevention and treatment strategies. ■

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# WORLD DIABETES DAY

14 NOVEMBER



World Diabetes Day (WDD) was created in 1991 by IDF and the World Health Organization in response to growing concerns about the escalating health threat posed by diabetes. World Diabetes Day became an official United Nations Day in 2006 with the passage of United Nation Resolution 61/225. It is marked every year on **14 November**, the birthday of Sir Frederick Banting, who co-discovered insulin along with Charles Best in 1922.

WDD is the world's largest diabetes awareness campaign reaching a global audience of over 1 billion people in more than 160 countries. The campaign draws attention to issues of paramount importance to the diabetes world and keeps diabetes firmly in the public and political spotlight.

The World Diabetes Day campaign aims to be the:

- Platform to promote IDF advocacy efforts throughout the year.
- Global driver to promote the importance of taking coordinated and concerted actions to confront diabetes as a critical global health issue

The campaign is represented by a blue circle logo that was adopted in 2007 after the passage of the UN Resolution on diabetes. The blue circle is the global symbol for diabetes awareness. It signifies the unity of the global diabetes community in response to the diabetes epidemic.

Every year, the World Diabetes Day campaign focuses on a dedicated theme that runs for one or more years. The theme for World Diabetes Day 2020 is The Nurse and Diabetes. Messaging and materials will start to be made available during the second quarter of 2020.

## **DIABETES: NURSES MAKE THE DIFFERENCE**

The theme for World Diabetes Day 2020 is The Nurse and Diabetes. The campaign aims to raise awareness around the crucial role that nurses play in supporting people living with diabetes.

**Nurses currently account for over half of the global health workforce.** They do outstanding work to support people living with a wide range of health concerns. People who either live with diabetes or are at risk of developing the condition need their support too.

People living with diabetes face a number of challenges, and **education** is vital to equip nurses with the skills to support them.

As the number of people with diabetes continues to rise across the world, the role of nurses and other health professional support staff becomes increasingly important in **managing the impact of the condition**.

Healthcare providers and governments must recognise the importance of investing in education and training. With the right expertise, nurses can **make the difference** for people affected by diabetes.

## NURSES AND DIABETES

The theme of World Diabetes Day 2020 is **The Nurse and Diabetes**. The campaign aims to raise awareness around the crucial role that nurses play in supporting people living with diabetes.

**According to the World Health Organization (WHO):**

- Nurses accounts for **59% of health professionals**.
- The global nursing workforce is 27.9 million, of which **19.3 million are professional nurses**.
- The global shortage of nurses in 2018 was **5.9 million**. 89% of that shortage is concentrated in low- and middle-income countries

The number of nurses trained and employed **needs to grow by 8% a year** to overcome alarming shortfalls in the profession by 2030.

WHO estimates that the total investment required to achieve the targets outlined in the Social Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030 stand at 3.9 trillion USD – 40% of which should be dedicated to **remunerating the health workforce**.

Investing in the health workforce also has the capacity to impact other SDGs on eradicating poverty, ensuring inclusive and equitable education, achieving gender equality through the employment and empowerment of women, and promoting decent work and sustainable and inclusive economic growth. IDF is speaking to policy-makers and nurses directly about the steps that can be taken to ensure health professionals are best prepared to support people living with diabetes in their communities – through better education and funding.

## NURSES: MAKE THE DIFFERENCE FOR DIABETES

As a highly valued member of the community, nurses do outstanding work to support people living with a wide range of health concerns. People



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who either live with diabetes or are at risk of developing the condition need their support too.

People living with diabetes face a number of challenges, and education is vital to equip nurses with the skills to support them. IDF wants to facilitate opportunities for nurses to learn more about the condition and receive training so that they can make a difference for people with diabetes.

**An online course** – The Role of the Diabetes Educator – is available to help nurses assess what they know about diabetes and improve their knowledge and understanding of the condition.

### **DIABETES: NURSES MAKE THE DIFFERENCE**

As the number of people with diabetes continues to rise across the world, the role of nurses and other health professional support staff is becoming increasingly important in managing the impact of the condition. Nurses are often the first and sometimes only health professional that a person interacts with and so the quality of their initial assessment, care and treatment is vital.

#### **Nurses play a key role in:**

- Diagnosing diabetes early to ensure prompt treatment.
- Providing self-management training and psychological support for people with diabetes to help prevent complications.
- Tackling the risk factors for type 2 diabetes to help prevent the condition.

There remains a significant need for more education and funding to equip nurses around the world with the skills to support people living with diabetes and those at risk of developing type 2 diabetes.

Healthcare providers and governments must therefore recognise the importance of investing in education and training. With the right expertise, nurses can make the difference for people affected by diabetes.

On behalf of people living with, and affected

by diabetes, IDF is **requesting national governments** to recognise and advance the role of nurses in diabetes care.

### **FACTS & FIGURES**

The IDF Diabetes Atlas provides the latest figures, information and projections on the global impact of diabetes.

#### **DIABETES**

- 463 million adults (1-in-11) were living with diabetes in 2019 The number of people living with diabetes is expected rise to 578 million by 2030.
- 1 in 2 adults with diabetes remain undiagnosed (232 million). The majority have type 2 diabetes.
- More than 3 in 4 people with diabetes live in low and middle-income countries.
- 1 in 6 live births (20 million) are affected by high blood glucose (hyperglycaemia) in pregnancy.
- Two-thirds of people with diabetes live in urban areas and three-quarters are of working age.
- 1 in 5 people with diabetes (136 million) are above 65 years old.
- Diabetes caused 4.2 million deaths in 2019.
- Diabetes was responsible for at least \$760 billion in health expenditure in 2019 – 10% of the global total spent on healthcare.

#### **NURSING**

- Nurses account for 59% of health professionals – the largest occupational group
- The global nursing workforce is 27.9 million, of which 19.3 million are professionals
- The global shortage of nurses is estimated to be 5.9 million, of which 89% is in low and lower middle-income countries
- Nursing graduates need to increase by 8% a year to overcome the predicted global shortfall by 2030
- Approximately 90% of the nursing workforce is female ■

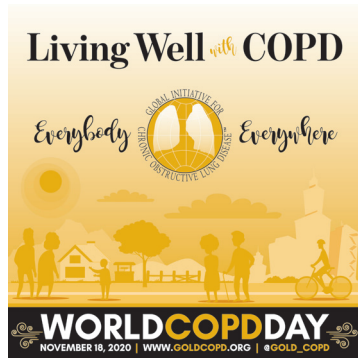

Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) is a preventable and treatable disease that causes breathlessness, chronic sputum production and cough.

COPD is currently the 3rd leading cause of death globally and is highly prevalent in low resource countries. There are 300 million current cases of COPD in the world. Exposure to tobacco smoke and other inhaled toxic particles and gases are the main risk factors for COPD.

World COPD Day is organized by the Global Initiative for Chronic Obstructive Lung Disease (GOLD) in collaboration with World Health Organisation (WHO) throughout the world. The aim is to increase awareness about this disease among health professionals and among common public. It enables Doctors and Health administrators to share knowledge, and discuss methods to reduce the incidence



and prevalence of COPD worldwide and present novel therapeutic strategies for COPD worldwide.

The first World COPD Day was held in the year 2002. Each and every year, organisers in more than 50 countries have carried out events and activities, making the day one of the world's most important for COPD awareness

The 19th annual World COPD Day is on November 18, 2020.

Each year GOLD organisation chooses a theme and coordinates activities throughout the world. These activities are organized in each country by health care professionals, educators, and members of the public who want to help make an impact.

The 2020 theme for World

COPD Day is “Living Well with COPD – Everybody, Every where”.

The aim of this year theme is to send a positive message to both patients and providers that although COPD does not have a cure, there are many ways to actively live well.

This campaign aims to raise awareness for interventions like pulmonary rehabilitation, physical activity, self-management, and nutrition, as well as highlight the importance of social and mental well-being. Worldwide education on these types of services can help raise awareness and promote advocacy for better living conditions and societal responsibilities.

Although there is no current cure for COPD, actions to improve quality of life can take place everywhere. Employers can build for safe breathing environments, citizens to be responsible for air cleanliness. In addition, healthcare providers and policy makers can work together to improve access to spirometry, essential medications, and other treatments, including telehealth and other types of access for patients in remote settings.

We, at Institute of Lung care and Research (ILC), Hindusthan Hospital are planning to start a pulmonary rehabilitation clinic with nutritionist, clinical Psychologist and Physio-therapist as a part of this World COPD day events hoping to serve the needy patients with utmost care. ■

Here are a few Short falls of Running a Healthcare facility in India and how we can try to improve the same:

## 1. LICENCE AND APPROVAL

The licences and approvals required to run a healthcare institute are more than 25 in number and many of these have to be renewed every year. The manpower, energy and paper work required to maintain all these come with a cost.

Many developed countries have developed a single window system which is more efficient and less time consuming. Amalgamating various departments under two to three heads will also make the system easy for the end user. The world is moving towards digital and migrating many of these processes digital also will save time and limit paper trial. Few licencings such as AERB approval approval for X-ray generating radiological equipments have made the transformation successfully in the past couple of years.

The Duration of the validity is a highly debated one and if the above mentioned process is streamlined then we can confidently extend validity to at the least 5 years.

## 2. COSTING IN RUNNING HOSPITAL:

Small and mid size hospitals cater to about 80% of families in the Indian society. To meet the demands of poor people, these hospitals have to be

Cost effective. The tax structure with reference to property tax, electricity charges and biomedical waste management rules are based as commercial tariff. It leads to transferring the tax burden on to the patients. This can be fixed by introducing a separate tariff plan for Healthcare facilities which is intermediate between commercial and domestic charges.

## 3. MAN POWER AND MAINTANANCE:

The medical and paramedical persons working in mid size hospital require a little different working atmosphere from the industrial employees. Skilled and semi skilled workers should be available in holidays as well as odd hours. There may be absolutely no work in many days and they may be required to work with out any break in some days.

The labour laws should be open to minor changes and a more robust interface. A new system for Healthcare should be formulated as Industrial labour laws can not be applied to healthcare.

## 4. PURCHASE OF INSTRUMENTS:

The medical instruments, surgical instruments and diagnostic instruments are absolutely essential for running a hospital. These instruments need to be updated periodically and some should be discarded to be replaced with another advanced set of instruments. The current price

structure is more vendor friendly than end user friendly.

Hence we appeal the difference between production cost and the purchase price can be limited to 10% with a concession of tax.

## 5. DEFENSIVE PRACTICE:

The situation of mid size hospital practice has become defensive practice due to violence on health care workers, consumer cases and adverse remarks by press and TV. The press, TV or persons indulging in tarnishing the images of health care workers should be held accountable.

Any false complaint made against a hospital or health care worker should suitably be reciprocated with a fine on the persons giving false complaints or the media if the court verdict is in favour of the hospital.

## 6. INSURANCE COVERAGE:

The insurance coverage for treatment is always fixed too low for both in private and Govt. Sector. The actual cost incurred is always on the higher side.

A universal policy maker should be created and it should be an autonomous body represented by both government and private healthcare analysts. They would be in-charge of fixing the rate for treatment to be covered by any insurance policy Government or Private. ■

## FAMILY SECURITY SCHEME OF IMA TNSB

**Dear Dear colleagues of IMA TNSB and brothers and sisters of FSS,**

**Warm greetings to you all.**

China Covid-19 virus is still taunting our profession and is taking away precious lives. It does not spare anyone whether high or low. But people in villages are reasonably safe, probably because of fresh air, plenty of sunlight and uncongested residences. If they avoid going to towns and avoid taking part in any group activity, they are safer. I still thank late Professor of Civil Engineering of PSG Technology, Coimbatore, who made me accept demolition of half of my old nursing home building while constructing new extension, to provide inner courtyard so that there is good free fresh air circulation and good sunlight. So we have to shut our A/C, open the windows and install fans including exhaust fans. If we can install air purifier – modified to filter outside air and sent the filtered air from our back (not purifying room air only), and spent more time in the open clean environment, we can avoid getting infected to a certain extent.

Our FSS scheme is also being strained by the Chinese Covid-19. Unexpected demise of our members due to Covid-19 has raised the number more than 70 which were expected during the current 25<sup>th</sup> premium of 2020. So we must be ready to bear the burden with benevolent attitude to help our demised member's family. So far we have paid DFC to 87 families. Out of 87 families, 18 have unfortunately died due to COVID-19

From the time of starting our FSS scheme in 2004, we helped 801 families and paid DFC total = Rs.122,45,69,210.

We request all IMA members to realize the peril and join FSS to safe guard their family, using the concessions announced, like reduction in NRD amount and waiving of the waiting period for our new members, so that all new members' family will be eligible for DFC amount from the date of their joining the scheme (in case some unfortunate things happen due to Covid-19 virus).

Local branch Presidents, Hony. Secretaries, District coordinators and senior members have special responsibilities to explain to the non-FSS members and make them get benefit under the scheme.

Please do not forget, to help others, we must be hale and healthy. Please observe all the precautions to avoid getting the killer viral infection.

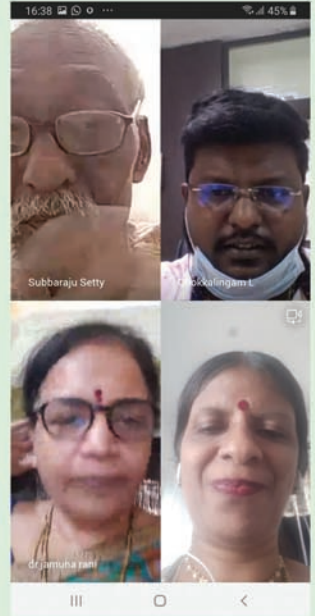
